




Election 2020: Larger Shares of Diverse Voters Ahead




2019 Points of Pride: Early Learning & K-12

- Hosted two successful Hill Briefings, in partnership with The LEGO Foundation and America Forward's Early Learning Working Group, on whole-child approaches to early learning
- Supported the launch of the Bipartisan Congressional Pre-K Caucus
- Endorsed the Trauma-Informed Schools Act and advocated for trauma-informed provisions to be included in federal education laws











2020 Strategy: Early Learning & K-12



- Continue to push and gain champions for priorities in our Early Learning and K-12 Education Policy Platforms
- Produce a Policy and Advocacy Playbook outlining specific early learning and K-12 policy priorities focused on whole learner approaches to education
- Collaborate with Coalition members to develop ideas around what is working and what needs to be changed in a future reauthorization of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)



2019 Points of Pride: Higher Education

- Higher Education Act reauthorization: The House Education Committee introduced the College Affordability Act in the fall which has been passed out of Committee
- A number of our policy priorities are embedded in the legislation
- We continue to advocate for additional priorities as the bill is getting ready for the House floor, including incorporating provisions of the FINISH Act into the bill



2020 Strategy: Higher Education



- Both chambers are expected to consider bills to reauthorize the Higher Education Act this year
- House of Representatives: Floor action on the College Affordability Act is expected this spring
- Working with Jumpstart and other partners to support community service in Federal Work Study
- Advocating for provisions that support teacher and school leaders, partnerships, evidence based programs, and trauma-informed training
- Senate: Senate Education Committee leaders are drafting their own HEA reauthorization bill, further action is expected this spring/early summer



2019 Points of Pride: Workforce Development

- Monitored the implementation of the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act
- Continued to engage with the Committees on Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) reauthorization including evidence/outcomes based strategies, toward greater investment in training and metrics based upon employment outcomes, and moving away from work participation metrics









2020 Strategy: Workforce Development

- Following potential action currently planned for mid March by the White House to reconfigure a number of federal workforce programs which could include a number of consolidations and/or terminations
- Monitoring work by the House Education and Labor Committee Democrats to draft legislation for a new federal registered apprenticeship program sometime this year
- Tracking congressional response to the President's budget request to significantly increase funding for Career and Technical Education programs including for the CTE Innovation Fund (in which America Forward played a significant authorization role)





2019 Points of Pride: Pay for Success, Evidence & Innovation

- **Bipartisan introduction of Bipartisan FINISH Act:** Fund for Innovation and Success in Higher Education (FINISH) Act to build evidence and authorize Pay for Success in Higher Education Act introduced in both chambers of Congress, by Senators Todd Young (R-IN), Michael Bennet (D-CO) and Tim Scott (R-SC) and Reps. Ben McAdams (D-UT) and Ron Wright (R-TX)
- Creation of the Bipartisan House What Works Caucus: Chaired by Reps. Jackie Walorski (R-IN) and Ben McAdams (D-UT)
- Introduction of the Bipartisan Social Determinants Accelerator Act: In both chambers of Congress by Reps. Cheri Bustos (D-IL), Tom Cole (R-OK), Jim McGovern (D-MA) and Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-WA), and Sens. Todd Young (R-IN) and Debbie Stabenow (D-MI)
- Social Impact Partnership to Pay for Results Act (SIPPRA) Implementation: Following bipartisan
 2018 enactment, 21 proposals across the country, eight finalists involving numerous Coalition
 members from Alaska, California, Colorado, Oklahoma, Indiana, South Carolina, and two from New
 York, and a recent Question for the Record from Sen. Todd Young



2019 Points of Pride: Pay for Success, Evidence & Innovation (continued)

- Articulating an expansive vision for the future of PFS and Evidence-Building: Including a Stanford Social Innovation Review (SSIR) article in October, a deep dive hosted at the Sorenson Impact Center in November, and further expanded on in Part III of America Forward's 2020 Policy Playbook, in particular Part III, "How to Restore Belief in Government by Equipping Reformers to Deliver Results"
- Continued field innovation and new Coalition Members: Maycomb Capital, Per Scholas and Nurse-Family Partnership, and continued innovation on outcome-based funding, opportunities for engagement with key federal and state public sector stakeholders











2020 Priorities: Pay for Success, Evidence & Innovation

- Advance key legislative priorities: Position key provisions from FINISH Act in a Higher Education Act reauthorization. Push the Social Determinants bill. Expand What Works Caucus. Recruit more Hill champions.
- **Build Support in key federal agencies**: Push a successful implementation of SIPPRA, and for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) PFS guidance, so the field can move forward. Pursue agency pilots.
- Position key elements of PFS, Evidence and Innovation agenda for progress:
 - "Outcomes Infrastructure", including talent pipelines and data systems
 - Social innovation zones, pilots to blend and braid dollars, additional PFS authorities in funding streams
 - Build on and learn from SIPPRA, additional outcomes funds, new outcomes-based health projects
 - Put equity, community engagement, local capacity building and inclusion at the center of conversation
- State and local engagement: Build on discussions with State officials and local stakeholders, including in CO, FL, MA, OH, MI, MN and NC, on the future of outcome-based models in those states, including opportunities to scale effective approaches and build evidence with public dollars, and better understand what these communities need right now.
- Recruit new allies, and shape a new narrative around outcomes: Recruit partners in DC and states, on the campaign trail, in philanthropy, and in the nonprofit sector. Seek out opportunities to shape the narrative around PFS, evidence and outcomes, putting people, families and communities at the center of our work.



- Conducted online Nov 4-15 among a nationally representative sample of 1,000 full-time teachers
- Supplemental survey conducted online
 December 11-17 among a nationally representative sample of 500

 Teachers want effective preparation, professional development, improved compensation & benefits

Better Serve All Students

 Teachers believe schools are failing to meet students' needs and to provide safe, welcoming, and inclusive environments.

 Teachers want to be agents of change for their profession and their students, but feel unheard by decision-makers

- **Diversification of the teaching profession** to reflect and represent the ever-changing demographics of the student population.

Two gold-standard randomized, controlled trials prove Per Scholas' economic impact. Findings from 2017 include:


