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# Federal Update: Fiscal Year 2022 Appropriations

- **Administration**
  - On April 9, President Biden's skinny budget for FY2022 released
  - On May 28, Administration's Full budget request for FY2022 released
- **House**
  - Appropriations Subcommittees have held hearings
  - Released guidance on community project funding
  - House requests for LHHS-ED were due in April
  - House appropriations markups have been scheduled
  - House Budget Chair has filed a deeming resolution
- **Senate**
  - Appropriations Subcommittees are in process of holding hearings
  - Released guidance on congressionally-directed spending
  - Senate requests for LHHS-ED are due July 8
- **What's Next?**
  - Appropriations - Budget Resolution?
  - Non-appropriations - Budget Reconciliation? American Jobs Plan? Infrastructure package?

# Themes and Keywords You May Hear in Meetings

## More Conservative

- Fiscal/Budgetary Constraints
  - No new programs or spending
- State and Local Flexibility
- Innovation (focus on efficiency)
- Evidence of effectiveness



## More Progressive

- Racial Justice + Advancing Equity
- Strong Federal Investments in Education
- Strong Transparency & Accountability
- Innovation (focus on Equity)
- Evidence of effectiveness

# Questions You May Hear in Meetings

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Below are some content questions that might come up during your meetings.

- Q1: How is this addressing institutional racism and advancing equity?
- Q2: What is the return on investment of this program?
- Q3: Is this investment sufficient? Should we go further?
- Q4: Is this large increase / new program needed? Especially in light of recent investments through the American Rescue Plan?
- Q5: What is the evidence base for this program/authority?

And remember, if a question comes up in a meeting that you can't answer, that's completely fine! Say you'll get back to them.

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**Intros**

**Opening**

Why I Am / We Are Here Today

**Ask 1**

Short Pitch (use story + data)

**Ask 2**

Short Pitch (use story + data)

**Closing**

Restate Asks

**Q&A**

At End or Throughout



# 5 Reminders for Your Meetings

## Record

Record your outreach and meetings in the [Hill Week Target List](#)  
(*more on this later in the presentation*)

## Remind

24-hours before your meeting with an office, confirm the time, platform and send any additional materials ( e.g., the [appropriations letter](#), etc.)

## Relay

Highlight your organization's impact in the state/district represented by the Congressional offices you meet with via data and storytelling

## Record (again)

[Record takeaways/follow-ups](#) after each of your meetings  
(*more on this later in the presentation*)


## Relationship Build

After each meeting, send a thank you note to the office, including any follow-up items you promised to share

# Bring Asks to Life through Effective Storytelling



**Clearly And Concisely Communicate** individual's story and/or your organization's story



**Paint A Picture** of the individual themselves, peers they represent OR types of partners and communities served



**Communicate The Impact** of the issue on individuals OR your organization's impact on communities served



**Highlight Data And/Or Research** that makes stories and issues faced come alive OR which guide organization's work



**Memorable And Compelling Pitch**

Here are some "pro tips" to keep in mind as you answer the questions + dive into the storytelling training.

- 1) Be clear and concise.
- 2) Share who you are / who your organization is.
- 3) Point a picture of the people or communities you serve.
- 4) Be specific about the challenges you face and demonstrate the need for and impact of your work focusing on advancing your organization's goals and America Forward's collective priorities.
- 5) If your personal story, or a story of an individual you serve helps to augment the organization's story, share it!
- 6) Know your story well! Write it down and practice.

exercises to help you tell your story or the story of your organization, draw connections to America Forward's shared story, and use this shared story to help educate federal policymakers.

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Here are some "pro tips" to keep in mind as you answer the questions + dive into the storytelling training.

- 1) Be clear and concise.
- 2) Share who you are and point a picture yourself and peers / the community you represent.
- 3) Communicate the impact of the issue upon you and be specific about the challenges you face. You may also want to share the impact that the organization you are joining this advocacy week with has upon you.
- 4) Highlight data and figures that make your story and the issues you face come alive. For example, if you are a college student and want to talk about federal student aid, the dollar amount your tuition has risen since you began college, or the dollar amount gap between your student aid and living costs.
- 5) Know your story well! Write it down and practice.
