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Federal Update: Fiscal Year 2022 Appropriations

Administration

- On April 9, President Biden's skinny budget for FY2022 released
- On May 28, Administration's Full budget request for FY2022 released

House

- Appropriations Subcommittees have held hearings
- Released guidance on community project funding
- House requests for LHHS-ED were due in April
- House appropriations markups have been scheduled
- House Budget Chair has filed a deeming resolution

Senate

- Appropriations Subcommittees are in process of holding hearings
- Released guidance on congressionally-directed spending
- Senate requests for LHHS-ED are due July 8

What's Next?

- Appropriations Budget Resolution?
- Non-appropriations Budget Reconciliation? American Jobs Plan? Infrastructure

Themes and Keywords You May Hear in Meetings

More Conservative

- Fiscal/BudgetaryConstraints

More Progressive

- Racial Justice + Advancing Equity
- Strong Federal Investments in Education
- Strong Transparency & Accountability
- Innovation (focus on Equity)
- Evidence of effectiveness





Questions You May Hear in Meetings

Below are some content questions that might come up during your meetings.

- Q1: How is this addressing institutional racism and advancing equity?
- Q2: What is the return on investment of this program?
- Q3: Is this investment sufficient? Should we go further?
- Q4: Is this large increase / new program needed? Especially in light of recent investments through the American Rescue Plan?
- Q5: What is the evidence base for this program/authority?

And remember, if a question comes up in a meeting that you can't answer, that's completely fine! Say you'll get back to them.





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Typical Hill Meeting Flow

Intros America Forward Coalition + All on Call

Opening Why I Am / We Are Here Today

Ask 1 Short Pitch (use story + data)

Ask 2 Short Pitch (use story + data)

Closing Restate Asks

Q&A At End or Throughout



5 Reminders for Your Meetings

Record

Record your outreach and meetings in the <u>Hill Week Target List</u> (more on this later in the presentation)

Remind

24-hours before your meeting with an office, confirm the time, platform and send any additional materials (e.g., the <u>appropriations letter</u>, etc.)

Relay

Highlight your organization's impact in the state/district represented by the Congressional offices you meet with via data and storytelling

Record (again)

Record takeaways/follow-ups after each of your meetings (more on this later in the presentation)

Relationship Build

After each meeting, send a thank you note to the office, including any follow-up items you promised to share
